# Study Commission needs your input for city

The new Constitution of the State of Montana provides for a study commission to be formed every ten years to review the present form of government and to propose to the voters any changes that citizen input calls for.

The Baker Study Commission has held several meetings in the last eight months but have failed to come up with any citizen input. If you would like to see any changes take place in our present local government or perhaps just to have some questions answered about the existing form, you may contact any commission member with your

ideas and plan to attend the next meeting of the commission.

If no one comes forward with any proposals for a change, the study commission can only assume that everyone in the city of Baker is completely satisfied with the present form of government and recommend no change to the voters in the spring election.

If you want any change, you must act now or you will have to wait another ten years before you get another chance.

The next meeting will be announced at a later date. Anyone with any input is urged to attend.
